
Oh Lord. Amen and Amen - am I right?

Quick highlights:

- There are no significant updates on our construction this month. We continue to wait for approval from the City, final plans from our architects, and pricing from our builders. (Rest assured that it is not due to lack of effort.) A Peek into the Pulpit

May 5th, 2024 John 15:9-17

This scripture sounds conditional. "You are my friends if you do what I say, act how I say, live how I say." It sounds like Jesus is setting up a test for the disciples to pass. But the question for us in this service is less about passing a test, and more about creating a way of life. What does it mean to abide in God's love? What does it mean to love one another? Can we try and fail and try again?

May 12th, 2024 Psalm 47; Acts 1:1-8

In this service, we put into practice the phrase: singing is praying twice. We lift up our praises to God with clapping hands, dancing feet, and loud voices - a whole-body kind of worship! Can we take our whole-body worship on Sunday, and bring it with us to our lives the rest of the week?

May 19th, 2024 Acts 2:1-21

On Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate that the Holy Spirit, the helper and sustainer of us all, falls on all flesh and unites people of every age, gender, race and walk of life. This is also Confirmation Sunday, in which we celebrate and welcome our new members into the church, and wonder together about how we can broaden our welcome and greet the spirit in one another.

May 26th, 2024 John 3:1-17

On Trinity Sunday, we take a moment to rest in and recognize the mystery and beauty of God. God lives in relationship: God, Jesus and the Spirit are three faces of the same being, three interactions with the same divinity. The how and why are a mystery- and thank God, indeed, because with mystery comes faith. With mystery comes more possibility than we could ever imagine on our own.
